## QUICK HITS

- The Huskies had 35 days at home between their first and second road games (at Oregon and Arizona) and will have another 27 before their next, this Saturday at USC.
- Washington has never committed as many as 10 penalties 43 games under Coach Tyrone Willingham. The UW currently ranks 10th in the nation in fewest penalty yards per game.

## WASHINGTON vs. #7/6 USC Dawgs Return To The Road With Trip To Los Angeles

**THE GAME:** The Washington football team (0-7 overall, 0-4 in the Pac-10) plays only its second road game in two months this Saturday when the Dawgs travel to Los Angeles to face USC (6-1 overall, 4-1 Pac-10) at the Coliseum. The game, set to kick off at 3:30 p.m. PT, will air live on FSN television. The Trojans represent the fourth ranked team the Huskies have faced this season as USC is No. 7 in the Associated Press top 25 and No. 6 in the coaches' poll. After the USC game, the Dawgs return to Husky Stadium for its final two home games vs. Arizona State and UCLA.

**HUSKIES vs. TROJANS HISTORY:** Washington and USC have played one another 78 times since the series began in 1923. The Trojans hold a 48-26-4 series advantage, although the Huskies have gone 7-8-1 over the last 16. Washington won its first-ever meeting against the Trojans, beating USC, 22-0, in Seattle in 1923. When the series re-started in 1927, USC handed the Huskies six straight defeats before Washington reeled off five in a row. The longest streak either way in the series began in 1965, when the Trojans beat Washington for the first time of 10 straight wins. The Huskies are 16-19-4 in the 39 games played in Husky Stadium and 10-28-0 against the Trojans in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. Last year, the No. 1 Trojans escaped Seattle with a 27-24 win, the second of two straight close matchups. USC overcame three turnovers (one of them an interception returned for a TD by Mesphin Forrester) and 16 penalties. USC out-gained Washington with 460 yards of total offense to the Huskies' 190, but only won the game by three points. In 2006 in L.A., the Huskies dropped a 26-20 heartbreaker to the No. 3 Trojans as time ran out with the Huskies' on the Trojans' 15-yard line. The year before in Seattle, the No. 1 Trojans used a 23-point second quarter to break open a previously close game in a 51-24 win. In 2004, the top-ranked Trojans handed the UW a 38-0 loss, breaking the Huskies' 271-game scoring streak, the longest in Division I-A at the time. The most recent Husky win over the Trojans came in 2001, when Husky kicker John Anderson booted a 32-yard field goal with no time remaining for a 27-24 Husky victory. In that game, backup QB Taylor Barton came on in place of injured starter Cody Pickett to lead the visitors to the win. Sixth-year USC coach Pete Carroll is 6-1 as the Trojan's head man vs. Washington. Husky head coach Tyrone Willingham, who faced the Trojans as head coach at Stanford, Notre Dame and at the UW, is 4-9 against USC – 4-3 while at Stanford, 0-3 while coaching the Irish and 0-3 as the Husky head man.

**vs. LOS ANGELES SCHOOLS:** Washington has a combined record of 55-84-6 (.400) against the two Pac-10 schools from Los Angeles: 29-36-2 vs. UCLA and 26-48-4 against USC. While that combined record may not sound that successful, it's worth noting that no team in the Pac-10 has a winning record against either one of the two L.A. schools (other than USC's record vs. UCLA). In fact, Washington has more wins against the Trojans and Bruins (combined) than every conference school except California (58-109-6 (.353) combined record), and has a better winning percentage against the two than every team in the league. The next closest is Arizona State, which has totaled a combined mark of 17-31-1 (.357) against the Bruins and Trojans.

**TELEVISION:** The Washington-USC game will air live on to a national audience on FSN television with Barry Tompkins, Petros Papadakis and Jim Watson providing the commentary. Additionally, "Huskies All-Access" airs Thursday evening on FSN. The program is an up-close look at each Husky game, with features, one-on-one interviews and sideline video.

**RADIO:** The Washington ISP Sports Network, with its flagship station KJR 950-AM, will carry the live broadcast of every football game to three different states and British Columbia, Canada, on 21 different radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Chuck Nelson are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. Many game broadcasts will also be carried on XM Satellite Radio on channel 194, 195 or 196 and can be heard over the internet via the Dawg Channel at gohuskies.com.

**THE COACH:** Tyrone Willingham was named Washington's 22nd head football coach on December 13, 2004. A former head coach at Notre Dame and Stanford, Willingham became the first African-American to serve as the Huskies head coach. Now in his fourth season at the UW, he brings an impressive resume with him to the Husky program. Willingham has acquitted himself well among his peers for much more than just fielding winning teams. Over the past 31 years Willingham has developed a coaching style that emphasizes toughness, enthusiasm, intelligence, discipline, commitment and unselfish play. The result has provided his players with more than just the opportunity to enjoy victories on the field. His guiding principles have prepared his players to be successful in life. Willingham, who turned 54 last Dec. 30, served as the head coach at Stanford (1995-2001) and Notre Dame (2002-2004) before coming to the UW. His Stanford teams enjoyed a 44-36-1 record while he was 21-15 with the Fighting Irish. In his inaugural season with the Irish in 2002, he wasted no time reversing the tide of the Irish program, leading Notre Dame to a 10-2 regular-season record and a trip to the 2003 Gator Bowl in Jacksonville, Fla. He was named Sportsman of the Year by The Sporting News after the 2002 season, while also picking up several national coach of the year awards. Prior to his tenure at Notre Dame, Willingham directed the Stanford program for seven seasons. In 1999, the Cardinal won the Pac-10 and earned a trip to the Rose Bowl for the first time since 1972, earning Willingham Pac-10 Coach of the Year honors. He also led the Cardinal to the 1995 Liberty Bowl, the 1996 Sun Bowl and the 2001 Seattle Bowl. Willingham, who grew up in Jacksonville, N.C., played both football and baseball at Michigan State, earning three letters in both sports and was awarded the Big Ten Conference Medal of Honor as the outstanding scholar-athlete in the league. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1977 and, aside from his two previous head coaching stints, has served as a full-time assistant at Central Michigan, Michigan State, North Carolina State, Rice and Stanford, as well as with the Minnesota Vikings. Here's a look at Willingham's head coaching career:

**PAC-10 DOUBLE DIP:** It used to be somewhat unusual to find a Pac-10 head coach who had previously been the head man at another school in the conference. Now, UW coach Tyrone Willingham is one of three that fit that bill, alongside UCLA coach Rick Neuheisel (formerly of Washington) and ASU coach Dennis Erickson (formerly of WSU and OSU). Willingham, who previously spent seven seasons in charge at Stanford, is the third straight UW coach to have previously been the head man at another league program as his predecessor Keith Gilbertson was formerly Cal's head coach.

**WILLINGHAM vs. THE PAC-10:** Thanks mostly to his time at Stanford, but also via frequent games vs. Western teams while at Notre Dame, Tyrone Willingham has amassed a lengthy record against Pac-10 teams. Overall, Willingham is 53-50 against Pac-10 teams. Interestingly, his teams have struggled the most against UW, as he went 1-6 against his current team. Here's Willingham's record against each Pac-10 team: Arizona (4-5), Arizona State (4-6), California (8-2), Oregon (4-5), Oregon State (3-7), Stanford (4-2), UCLA (4-6), USC (4-9), Washington (1-6), Washington State (7-4).

**COACHING STAFF:** Washington's coaching staff, under fourth-year head coach Tyrone Willingham, saw its biggest turnover in his tenure with three new assistant coaches on this year's staff – defensive coordinator Ed Donatell, running backs coach Steve Gervais and tight ends and special teams coach Brian White. The UW's current list of assistants includes a number of names that are familiar to savvy Pac-10 football fans. Willingham, of course, spent seven seasons in charge of Stanford, where he'd previously served as an assistant (1989-91) for three seasons. And, two members of the Husky staff from 2004 season were held over as well, lending more than a little familiarity. Defensive line coach Randy Hart is working for his fifth different head coach as a member of the Husky staff while linebackers coach Chris Tormey, is beginning his 17th season at the UW, spread over three different stints. Aside from those three, several other UW coaches came to Seattle with experience in or around the Northwest. Spokane native Tim Lappano previously worked at Idaho, Washington State, California, Oregon State and with the Seattle Seahawks. Donatell has spent much of his coaching career in the NFL, but was a graduate assistant at the UW in 1981 and 1982. Finally, Mike Denbrock (offensive line) worked one season at Stanford. Only White, Gervais and wide receivers coach Charlie Baggett, who has spent much of his career in the NFL, don't trace their coaching roots through the Pac-10 before coming to the UW. White, however, did square off vs. the UW last season when he was on the Syracuse staff and Gervais is a local product, having served as head coach at four Puget Sound-area high schools, winning six state titles overall. One of the two Husky grad assistants is in his second season and was well known before that as former North Carolina QB Luke Huard is the younger brother for former Husky signal callers Damon and Brock Huard. The other grad assistant, in his first season at the UW, is Torrey Myers, who has coached mainly in New Mexico.

**WASHINGTON-USC TIES:** There are a few relevant connections between the UW and USC coaching staffs. Tyrone Willingham went to work at North Carolina State in 1983, the year after Pete Carroll had just completed three seasons with the Wolfpack. USC defensive coordinator Nick Holt was an assistant at Idaho from 1990 to 1997. For three of those seasons, he worked under Chris Tormey, who's now the Huskies' linebackers coach. As far as players go, long snapper Danny Morovick's father, Dan, played at USC in the late '70s. Conversely, 'SC safety Taylor Mays, from Seattle's O'Dea High, is the son of former Husky defensive lineman Stafford Mays, who lettered in 1978 and 1979. Mays is the only player on the USC roster from the state of Washington, and he went to the same high school (O'Dea) as five current Huskies: Johri Fogerson, Ben Hayes, Daniel Kanczugowski, Quinton Richardson and Chancellor Young. As is the case each year, a good deal of UW and USC players have played with or against one another in high school due to the number of Huskies from the L.A. area. The Huskies roster includes 30 players from southern California: OL Mark Armelin (Canoga Park), P/PK Jared Ballman (San Deigo), WR Anthony Boyles (Compton), C Greg Christine (Camarillo), Byron Davenport (Long Beach), DL Tyrone Duncan (Westlake Village), OL Skyler Fancher (Costa Mesa), PK Erik Folk (Woodland Hills), SS Mesphin Forrester (Los Angeles), QB Ronnie Fouch (Redlands), TB David Freeman (Inglewood), LB Joshua Gage (Huntington Beach), WR D'Andre Goodwin (Pacoima), PK Kevin Howe (San Juan Capistrano), LB Matt Houston (Goleta), TB Brandon Johnson (Hawthorne), LB Darrion Jones (Lynwood), CB Adam Long (Los Angeles), LS Danny Morovick (Mission Viejo), DT Craig Noble (Los Angeles), DT Jovon O'Connor (Los Angeles), CB Marquis Persley (Redlands), TB Chris Polk (Redlands), OT Morgan Rosborough (Long Beach), OL Matt Sedillo (Escondido), LB Chris Stevens (Mojave), S Greg Walker (Bellflower), FS Jason Wells (LaVerne), DL Nick Wood (Poway) and DB Warren Woods (Walnut).

**PLAYING THE FRESHMEN:** Washington has utilized a total of 12 true freshmen this season, its most in modern school history. Additionally, nine different true

freshmen have started a game. A total of eight true freshman saw action in the Huskies' season opener at Oregon: Devin Aguilar, Jermaine Kearse, Senio Kelemete, Kavario Middleton, Chris Polk, Jordan Polk, Alameda Ta'amu, Everrette Thompson. In the BYU game, freshman tailback David Freeman made his debut, and vs. Oklahoma, Johri Fogerson started at safety, increasing the total to 10 true freshmen. At Arizona, receiver Cody Bruns and tailback Terrence Dailey made their UW debuts. The total easily surpasses the seven freshmen who saw action in the 2007 season. In 2006, only two true freshmen played. In the Oregon game, two freshman (C. Polk at tailback and Middleton at tight end) started the game. Chris Polk, Kelemete and Middleton all started vs. Brigham Young while, vs. Oklahoma, Freeman, Fogerson, Aguilar, Kearse and Kelemete all started. Ta'amu started at Arizona and Dailey made his first start vs. Oregon State. **SEPTEMBER (AND MOST OF OCTOBER) IN SEATTLE:** With three home games and an off week during the month, the Huskies spent their entire September at home in Seattle this year. They also played just one road game during the month of October (Oct. 4 at Arizona). The Dawgs opened Aug. 30 in Eugene, Ore., and didn't return to the road until their game in Tucson. With the bye week, that was four straight Saturdays and 35 straight days at home. The 35-day gap between home games is tied for the fifth-longest in the nation (FBS) this season. The Huskies also have a 27-day gap before their next home game, Saturday at USC. Somewhat surprisingly,

these long home stretches aren't as unusual as you might think. In 2003, the UW opened on Aug. 30 at Ohio State and, just like this year, had three home games and an off week before playing on Oct. 4 at UCLA. In 2002, the Dawgs played FIVE consecutive home games (with an off week) after opening at Michigan on Aug. 31. That UW team didn't return to the road until Oct. 19. The Huskies also spent four straight Saturdays in October at home (all games; no off weeks) in 1998, just to name one other somewhat recent example.

**THE RED ZONE:** Washington is 13-for-18 in the red zone this season. After starting the year 5-for-5, the Huskies were only 1-for-3 vs. Oklahoma, but went 4-for-4 vs. Stanford, 2-for-2 at Arizona, 0-for-3 vs. Oregon State and 1-for-1 vs. Notre Dame. The Huskies have foiled their opponents in three of 26 red-zone trips, getting a missed field goal at Oregon, a fumble vs. BYU, and the end of the game at Arizona. Here's a breakdown of the Huskies and their opponents in the red zone this year:

**ONLY THE BIG BOYS:** As of last season, Washington is one of just five NCAA Division I-A programs that has never faced a non-Division I-A opponent since the current division setup was established in 1978 (the division's names have undergone a change this year, but the setup is still the same). Both Michigan and Ohio State fell of the club as the Wolverines opened last season with Appalachian State and the Buckeyes vs. Youngstown State, both on the same day. The five schools that have yet to play a non-Division I-A opponent since the advent of the current format are Michigan State, Notre Dame, USC, UCLA and Washington.

**ROSTER CHANGES:** As always, a number of changes have occurred to the UW roster since it was published in the media guide. For the most accurate and up-to-date roster, please refer to the final two pages of this press release.

**DECADE AFTER DECADE:** Washington has won a conference title and a trip to the Rose Bowl in each of the last nine decades, dating back to the 1920s when Washington won the berth in 1923 and 1925. In the 1930s, the Dawgs won the '36 title. In the '40s, Washington earned the trip in 1943 and then barely slipped in under the wire in the 1950s, winning the 1959 crown. The Huskies won two Rose Bowl berths in the 1960s -- 1960 and 1963 -- and one in the 1970s (1977). Titles in 1980 and 1982 did it for that decade and three straight trips to Pasadena to begin the 1990s covered that 10-year span. Now in the 2000s, UW was the first team to earn Rose Bowl berths in nine straight decades. USC joined the Dawgs in that distinction in 2004 after their New Year's Day appearance in Pasadena.

**FINISHING FIRST OR SECOND:** Despite a lower division finishes in the Pac-10 the last four years, Washington has finished either first or second in the conference (including ties) in 18 of the last 31 seasons, dating back to a fourth-place finish in 1976. Over that span, Washington has won the championship (outright or shared) eight times -- 1977, 1980, 1981, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995 and 2000 -- while finishing second 10 other times.

**THE 100-YARD FACTOR:** Since the 1947 season, Washington is 166-46-3 (.779) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies went 3-1 in such games in 2003, 1-1 in 2004, 2-3 in 2005, 2-1 in 2006; 3-4 in 2007 and are 0-1 in such games this season. The Huskies' only 100-yard performance of the season was vs. Oregon State (Terrance Dailey, 102 yards).

**HISTORY LESSON:** Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 71 times. The Huskies' record stands at 59-11-1 (.838) in those contests. Since the 1995 season, Washington is 34-8-1 (.802) when rushing for 200 yards. The UW was 3-3 in such games last year (wins vs. Syracuse, Stanford and Cal; losses to Arizona, WSU, Hawaii).

**PLAYING AT HOME:** Washington has gone unbeaten at home 13 times in its history, including six times in the last 19 seasons. Washington has won 79 of its last 118 (.674) games at Husky Stadium with one tie (79-38-1). Since 1980, the Huskies stand 127-49-2 (.719) at home. Since 1990, the Huskies are 49-27-1 (.643) at Husky Stadium vs. Pac-10 opponents.

**HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM:** The 2008 season marks the 89th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. Thanks to several major renovations, Husky Stadium's seating capacity has increased to its current total of 72,500. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium currently stands at 344-161-21 (.674).

**FAMILY TIES:** As is the case with most seasons of Husky football, there are a number of players on the Washington football team related to either current or former Huskies. Linebacker Trenton Tuiasosopo is a first cousin of former Huskies Marques and Zach Tuiasosopo as well as older sister, Leslie, a standout Husky volleyball player and now an assistant coach for the UW volleyball team, and younger sister Ashley, a sophomore on the Husky softball team. Fullback Luke Kravitz' father Al, was a defensive end that lettered at the UW in 1970 and 1971. Fullback Paul Homer is a cousin, by marriage, of former Husky offensive lineman Aaron Dalan, who married former Washington women's basketball player Gena Pelz. Cornerback Matt Mosley is a cousin to former Husky Luther Carr. Outside linebacker Fred Wiggs is the younger brother of former Husky defensive lineman Sekou Wiggs and, freshmen Chris Polk and Jordan Polk are cousins. Lastly, freshmen Riley Gervais and Taylor Lappano are the sons of current Husky assistant coaches Steve Gervais and Tim Lappano.

**LOCKER ON THE RUN:** Last season, with four games yet to play, Jake Locker had already broken Dennis Fitzpatrick's UW record for rushing yards in a season by a quarterback. By season's end, Locker's 986 yards were a Pac-10 and school single-season record and second-most in a *career* by a UW QB. Locker's 157-yard rushing day vs. Arizona was ranked No. 3 on the UW's single-game, QB rushing list, behind Fitzpatrick's 249 (vs. WSU, 1974) and Marques Tuiasosopo's 207 (vs. Stanford, 1999). As a whole, entering the season, the Husky line had started a total of 75 games: Casey Bulyca, 11; Juan Garcia, 25; Cody Habben, 3; Ben Ossai, 21; Ryan Tolar, 12; Jordan White-Frisbee, 3 (not counting 8 starts as a DT in 2004). That number did not count tackle Nick Scott, a regular starter the last two seasons at Drake.

## MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

**OVERALL ATHLETIC SUCCESS:** Having firmly established itself as one of the top broad-based Division I intercollegiate athletics programs in the country, the University of Washington once again placed in the top echelon in the annual U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup competition in the 2007-2008 academic year. Husky athletics finished 22nd among all NCAA Division I institutions (279 schools earned at least a point and were ranked) in the annual standings. Washington scored a total of 745.25 points in the Director's Cup, which is based solely on NCAA championship competition (and therefore didn't include the Huskies' national championship in men's rowing, which is not an NCAA sport). The 2007-08 Washington athletic season was highlighted by a number of team and individual successes, including a second-place national finish by the women's rowing team, a seventh-place finish at the NCAA men's golf championships and an eighth-place by the women's cross country team.

**GRADUATION SUCCESS RATE:** The UW football team once again had a good showing in the most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate report, released at the end in October, 2007. In the 2007 ranking (which measured graduation success rates for those who enrolled from 1997 to 2000 and graduated within six years), the UW football team ranked second in Pac-10 Conference at 64 percent, trailing only Stanford (93). Washington had also ranked second in the 2005 and 2006 ranking. Here are the Pac-10's 2007 NCAA Graduation Success Rate rankings:

- The Hepatitis B vaccine was developed by UW faculty member Ben Hall. Since it became widely available in 1986, millions of people all over the world have been protected from this debilitating disease.
- In a new program called "Husky Promise" announced last year and starting this fall, Washington state students from low income families will be able to attend the UW without ever having to worry about paying tuition--it will be free for them while they earn their bachelor's degree. The UW program is one of the largest in the nation making this commitment to those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.
