WASHINGTON at ARIZONA STATE Dawgs Head To The Desert To Face Sun Devils

THE GAME: After back-to-back nail-biters the last two Saturdays – a 37-30 overtime loss at Notre Dame and a miraculous 36-33 win over Arizona last Saturday in Seattle – the UW football team (3-3 overall, 2-1 in the Pac-10) returns to the road for a night game in the desert next Saturday at Arizona State (4-2 overall, 1-1 Pac-10). Kickoff is 7:15 p.m. (time is the same in Tempe and Seattle) and the game will air live on FSN television. After failing to win a game last year, the Huskies, under first-year head coach Steve Sarkisian, are in the midst of a remarkable turnaround as they're 3-3 at the halfway point despite having played the NCAA's third-toughest schedule. The remainder of the schedules consists only of Pac-10 games, with two off weeks mixed in. After the ASU game, the UW returns to Seattle for a date with Oregon on Oct. 24 before an off week on Halloween.

GAME THEMES vs. THE SUN DEVILS: Washington has scored a defensive touchdown in three straight games ... at Stanford, Justin Glenn returned a fumble (on a backwards pass) 51 yards for a score ... at Notre Dame, Desmond Trufant did the same, going 17 yards for the score ... against Arizona, Mason Foster returned an interception 37 yards for the game-winner ... Washington's red zone defense allowed opponents to score on 25 of 30 trips into the redzone this year, which is about average ... however, of those 25 scores only 11 have been TDs, with 14 field goals filling out the total ... UW opponents are 17-for-17 on field goals this season ... the Huskies have already been a part of three bona fide classics this year, with nail-biting wins over USC and Arizona and a gut-wrenching loss at Notre Dame ... Washington's schedule to date ranks as the third-toughest in the nation as, taking out their result against the UW, Husky opponents are 22-5 on the season ... Washington has had 10 true freshmen play this year, including four who have started at least one game: wide receiver James Johnson, defensive end Talia Crichton, cornerback Desmond Trufant and safety Nathan Fellner.

TELEVISION: The Washington-Arizona game will air live to a national audience on FSN with Barry Tompkins, Petros Papadakis and Michael Eaves providing the commentary. Additionally, "Huskies All-Access" airs each Wednesday evening on FSN. The program is an up-close look at each Husky game, with features, one-on-one interviews and sideline video.

RADIO: The Washington ISP Sports Network, with its flagship station KJR 950-AM, will carry the live broadcast of every football game on 16 Northwest radio stations. Longtime play-by-play man Bob Rondeau and color analyst Chuck Nelson are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. Many game broadcasts will also be carried on XM Satellite Radio on channel 193, 194 or 195 and can be heard over the internet via the Dawg Channel at gohuskies.com.

THE COACH: First-year head coach Steve Sarkisian came to the UW with a wealth of experience as a quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator. His string of success is nearly unprecedented as, during his time at USC, he coached two Heisman Trophy winners and oversaw one of the nation's most consistent and dominant offenses. Sarkisian spent 2007 and 2008 as the Trojans' assistant head coach and offensive coordinator. He had also previously served as assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach (2005-06), quarterbacks coach (2002-03) and as an offensive assistant (2001) at USC, for a total of seven seasons there. During his seven seasons as a member of the Trojans' staff, the team has posted a combined 74-15 record. As offensive coordinator, his record was 22-3. Aside from his various roles at USC, Sarkisian, 35, also spent one season as quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders in 2004 and as QBs coach at El Camino College in Torrance, Calif., in 2000, his first coaching job. A standout quarterback at BYU, Sarkisian actually faced his new team in Husky Stadium, on Sept. 14, 1996. That day, his Cougars suffered their only loss in a 14-1 season, falling to the Huskies, 29-17. Sarkisian completed 23-of-35 passes for 279 yards, no interceptions and two touchdowns. Known for mentoring quarterbacks, he coached an impressive line of signalcallers while at USC. Last year, Mark Sanchez wrapped up his college career with Pac-10 and Rose Bowl titles and was the fifth overall pick in the NFL Draft. Before Sanchez, Sarkisian helped John David Booty earn first-team All-Pac-10 status and a fifth-round NFL draft selection. In 2005, he helped Matt Leinart win the Johnny Unitas Award and first-team All-America before going 10th overall in the draft. In 2003, Leinart was also a first-team All-American and the Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Year. Sarkisian also mentored 2002 Heisman Trophy winner Carson Palmer in his first season as full-time quarterbacks coach. Sarkisian starred at the quarterback position at the prep, collegiate and pro levels. After his standout career at Brigham Young University, he was played for the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League for three seasons (1997-99). He had a record-setting two-year (1995-96) career at BYU, playing under legendary coach Lavell Edwards. Sarkisian completed 549-of-824 passes (66.6 percent) for 7,755 yards and 55 touchdowns in his career. His 162.0 career passing efficiency rating ranked third on the all-time NCAA list. As a senior in 1996, he led the nation in passing efficiency (173.6, No. 7 all-time) as the Western Athletic Conference champion. Cougars went 14-1 and won the 1997 Cotton Bowl. He was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year in 1996, earned second-team All-America honors and played in the East-West Shrine Game and Hula Bowl. As a junior in 1995, he earned all-conference honors and led BYU to the WAC title. Sarkisian transferred to BYU from El Camino Junior College, where he played two seasons (1993-94). He was a first-team Junior College All-America selection as a sophomore and earned all-conference honors in 1993 as a freshman. He also played baseball at El Camino in 1993. He originally enrolled at USC as a baseball player before transferring. Sarkisian was a standout football and baseball player at West Torrance (Calif.) High. He earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from BYU in 1997 after receiving his associate's degree from El Camino in 1994.

COACHING STAFF: Washington's assistant coaching staff is entirely new this season. While there are a couple of coaches who made their way to Washington via USC, like head coach Steve Sarkisian, more notably, many of the new coaches have very specific ties to the Northwest. Nick Holt is the UW's defensive coordinator, the role he served at USC the last three seasons. Holt, however, is tied to the Pacific Northwest by way of the fact that he was head coach at Idaho in 2004 and 2005. He was also an assistant with the Vandals from 1990-97. Offensive coordinator and QBs coach Doug Nussmeier, who grew up in the Portland, Ore., area was a star quarterback at Idaho, where he passed for 10,824 career yards and won the Walter Payton Award (the I-AA Heisman). He's also in the Idaho Athletic Hall of Fame, just like running backs coach Joel Thomas. Thomas, a native of Port Angeles, Wash., is still the Vandals' all-time leader in rushes, rushing yards and rushing TDs. Offensive line coach and run game coordinator Dan Cozzetto, who went to high school in Spokane, is another Idaho grad. Cozzetto, who was also the Washington line coach in 2003, came to the UW from Arizona State, but has also coached at Idaho under former head coach Dennis Erickson. Safeties coach Jeff Mills, who played his college football at Western Washington, was a graduate assistant at the UW in 1990 and 1991 under coach Don James. He helped the Dawgs to Pac-10 titles both seasons and the national championship in '91. Mills has also coached at Idaho. Defensive line coach/special teams coordinator/recruiting coordinator Johnny Nansen grew up in Long Beach, Calif., but played football at Washington State and comes to Seattle after spending five seasons at Idaho (including two under Holt). Finally, as to the Idaho connection, linebackers coach Mike Cox is a native of Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, played for the Vandals under Erickson and former Husky head coach Keith Gilbertson, and coached in Moscow from 1987-94. He came to Washington from the St. Louis Rams. Cornerbacks coach Demetrice Martin is new to the Northwest, having previously worked with Sarkisian at USC. Another newcomer to this part of the country, receivers coach Jimmie Dougherty, played at Missouri and most recently coached at the University of San Diego. Washington's two new graduate assistants are Mike Anderson (defense) and Brent Miller (offense). Anderson played at Idaho under Holt and is a native of Lewiston, Idaho. Miller, whose playing days at Arizona State ended with the 2007 season, once scored a game-winning touchdown in overtime at Husky Stadium.

ALL NEW STAFF: Every member of the UW's 2009 coaching staff is in his first season (at least of this stint) with the Huskies, meaning the entire staff, including graduate assistants, is new. According to research conducted by Utah State's sports information department, Washington is one of only two Division I FBS schools this year with an entirely new staff, including GAs (Utah State is the other). Auburn, Iowa State, Miami (Ohio), New Mexico and Toledo also have new full-time staffs, but retained at least one GA from the previous season.

HUSKIES vs. DEVILS HISTORY: The Huskies hold a 15-13 record all-time against Arizona State in a series that only dates back to 1975. That '75 game marked the only time that the two teams ever played one another prior to the Sun Devils joining the Pac-10 Conference prior to the 1978 season. Since then, the two have played one another every year between 1978 and now except for the 1983 and 1984 seasons and the 2003 and 2004 seasons. The Huskies lost that first-ever meeting at Tempe in 1975, 35-12, but routed the 12th-ranked Devils in the next matchup, winning 41-7 at Husky Stadium in 1978. One of the two teams (or both) has been ranked in 13 of the last 17 meetings, the only exceptions the 1999 game when the Devils came to Husky Stadium and beat Washington, 28-7, and the 2005, 2006 and 2008 games, all ASU wins. Some of the Huskies' most memorable games in recent history have come vs. ASU. In the 1995 season-opener, tailback Rashaan Shehee hit receiver Fred Coleman with a 30-yard TD pass late in the fourth quarter to give Washington a 23-20 win. The following year at Tempe, Washington trailed 42-21 before backup QB Brock Huard came on to lead the Huskies to three fourth-quarter TDs, but Robert Nycz kicked a 38-yard field goal with 0:02 left to win, 45-42. In 1998 at Sun Devil

Stadium, the Huskies pulled off the "Miracle in the Desert" as Huard hit tight end Reggie Davis with a 63-yard pass on fourth-and-17 with 0:28 left in the game to pull out a 42-38 Washington win. In 2001, the Huskies capped a seven-minute, 12-second drive with a 30-yard field goal with no time remaining to edge the Devils, 33-31. In 2005 in Tempe, ASU QB Rudy Carpenter passed for 401 yards and three TDs as the Devils pulled away in the second half of a 44-20 win. The 2006 game was another tight contest as the Devils pulled out a 26-23 overtime win at Husky Stadium. The UW trailed 20-6 before receiver Sonny Shackelford threw a TD pass to Anthony Russo and then caught a touchdown from backup QB Johnny DuRocher to send the game into OT. After a UW field goal, Rudy Carpenter hit Brent Miller with a 25-yard TD pass for the win. In 2007, 14th-ranked ASU came back from a halftime deficit to win, 44-20. Last year, the Devils led 16-13 at half, but pulled away for a 39-19 victory. Carpenter threw for 218 yards and two TDs while Keegan Herring rushed for 144 yards and one score. Dennis Erickson, as ASU head coach, and former head coach at Washington State, Miami (Fla.) and Oregon State, is 4-6 all-time against Washington. He went 1-1 vs. the UW while at WSU (lost in 1987, won in 1988), 0-1 at Miami (lost in 1994 – the famous "Whammy in Miami"), 1-3 at Oregon State (losses in 1999, 2000 and 2002 and a win in 2001) and 1-0 at ASU.

WASHINGTON-ARIZONA STATE TIES: While there are a numerous connections between the coaching staffs at Arizona State and Washington, there's very little crossover between UW's roster and ASU's – probably as little as the UW and any Pac-10 team. Arizona State head coach Dennis Erickson is a native of Everett, Wash., and graduated from Everett High in 1965. Erickson was also the head coach of the Seattle Seahawks, is a childhood friend of former Husky head coaches Jim Lambright and Keith Gilbertson and is the cousin of legendary former UW rowing coach Dick Erickson. UW offensive line coach and run game coordinator Dan Cozzetto has a relatively long association with Erickson, having worked on his staff at Arizona State, Oregon State and Idaho, as well as with the San Francisco 49ers. UW linebackers coach Mike Cox played for Erickson at Idaho while Johnny Nansen was on Erickson's staff at Idaho in 2006. ASU receivers coach Eric Yarber previously worked as an assistant coach at UW, in 2005 and 2006. Finally, UW grad assistant Brent Miller played at Arizona State through the 2007 season. As far as players go, Arizona State's roster doesn't include any players from the state of Washington. The Huskies' roster includes only two players from the state of Arizona – cornerback Matt Mosley (Chandler/Corona del Sol HS) and linebacker Kurt Mangum (Chandler). ASU kicker Jackson Allen also attended Corona del Sol, but no Devils went to Chandler. Other than that, however, no Husky players attended the same high school as any ASU player.

DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS: Washington has scored a defensive touchdown in three consecutive games. Three games ago at Stanford, safety Justin Glenn picked up a backwards pass and returned the fumble 51 yards for a touchdown. The following week at Notre Dame, Desmond Trufant scored on a similar play, returning a loose lateral 17 yards for a score. Against Arizona, linebacker Mason Foster notched an interception when a pass bounced off the receiver's feet and ran it back 37 yards for a game-winning touchdown.

THIRD-DOWN & RED-ZONE SUCCESS: One hallmark of the current season for the UW has been its success on third down and in the red zone. The Huskies currently rank fifth in the nation with a third-down conversion rate of 53.33 percent (48-of-90). Their 48 successful conversions are the second-most of any team in the country. In the red zone, Washington has scored 19 of 21 times this season, with only a lost fumble and a loss of downs marring a perfect record. That 19-for-21 mark (.905) rates 28th (tied) in the country. On defense, the Huskies have also had remarkable red-zone success. While opponents have scored in 25 of 30 attempts, they've been held to a field goal on 14 of those 25 scores, meaning that opponents have scored a touchdown on only 11 of 30 (.367) trips inside the UW 20-yard line.

TEAM NOTES

PLAYING THE FRESHMEN: Washington has utilized a total of 10 true freshmen this season as TB Demetrius Bronson, DE Talia Crichton, S Nate Fellner, CB Anthony Govern, WR James Johnson, DE Andru Pulu, TB Cole Sager, DT Semisi Tokolahi, CB Desmond Trufant and LB Jordan Wallace have all seen action this year. Among that group, Crichton, Johnson, Trufant and Fellner have all started at least one game. Last season, a school-record 12 true freshman played for the Huskies, with nine of them starting at least one game. This season's total of 10 betters the total number of nine true freshmen who played in 2003 and in 2000 and matches the second-highest total in school history – 1997, when the UW also utilized 10 freshmen.

CAPTAINS: At the "Raise the Woof!" kickoff celebration held on Aug. 28, the four captains for the 2009 season, as voted by their teammates, were revealed. They are senior LB Donald Butler (Sacramento, Calif.), junior QB Jake Locker (Ferndale, Wash.), senior DE Daniel Te'o-Nesheim (Waikoloa, Hawai'i) and junior C Ryan Tolar (Pasco, Wash.). Te'o-Nesheim was also voted as a season captain in 2008.

DECADE AFTER DECADE: Washington has won a conference title and a trip to the Rose Bowl in each of the last nine decades, dating back to the 1920s when Washington won the berth in 1923 and 1925. In the 1930s, the Dawgs won the '36 title. In the '40s, Washington earned the trip in 1943 and then barely slipped in under the wire in the 1950s, winning the 1959 crown. The Huskies won two Rose Bowl berths in the 1960s -- 1960 and 1963 -- and one in the 1970s (1977). Titles in 1980 and 1982 did it for that decade and three straight trips to Pasadena to begin the 1990s covered that 10-year span. In the 2000s, UW was the first team to earn Rose Bowl berths in nine straight decades. USC joined the Dawgs in that distinction in 2004 after their New Year's Day appearance in Pasadena.

FINISHING FIRST OR SECOND: Washington has finished either first or second in the conference (including ties) in 18 of the last 32 seasons, dating back to a fourth-place finish in 1976. Over that span, Washington has won the championship (outright or shared) eight times – 1977, 1980, 1981, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1995 and 2000 – while finishing second 10 other times.

THE 100-YARD FACTOR: Since the 1947 season, Washington is 166-48-3 (.772) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies went 3-1 in such games in 2003, 1-1 in 2004, 2-3 in 2005, 2-1 in 2006; 3-4 in 2007 and went 0-2 last year. This year, the UW fell at Notre Dame despite a 136-yard rushing effort from Chris Polk.

HISTORY LESSON: Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 72 times. The Huskies' record stands at 59-12-1 (.826) in those contests. Since the 1995 season, Washington is 34-9-1 (.784) when rushing for 200 yards.

PLAYING AT HOME: Washington has gone unbeaten at home 13 times in its history, including six times in the last 20 seasons. Washington has won 82 of its last 124 (.665) games at Husky Stadium with one tie (82-41-1). Since 1980, the Huskies stand 130-52-2 (.712) at home. Since 1990, the Huskies are 51-29-1 (.636) at Husky Stadium vs. Pac-10 opponents.

HISTORIC HUSKY STADIUM: The 2009 season marks the 90th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. Thanks to several major renovations, Husky Stadium's seating capacity has increased to its current total of 72,500. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium currently stands at 347-164-21 (.672).

FAMILY TIES: As is the case with most seasons of Husky football, there are a number of players on the Washington football team related to either current or former Huskies. Linebacker Trenton Tuiasosopo is a first cousin of former Huskies Marques and Zach Tuiasosopo as well as older sister, Leslie, a standout Husky volleyball player and now an assistant coach for the UW volleyball team, and younger sister Ashley, a junior on the Husky softball team. Fullback Paul Homer is a cousin, by marriage, of former Husky offensive lineman Aaron Dalan, who married former Washington women's basketball player Gena Pelz. Cornerback Matt Mosley is a cousin to former Husky Luther Carr. Outside linebacker Fred Wiggs is the younger brother of former Husky defensive lineman Sekou Wiggs, while tailback Chris Polk and wide receivers Jordan Polk are cousins. Freshman linebacker Jordan Wallace is the younger brother of former Husky safety C.J. Wallace, who now plays for the Seattle Seahawks. Another freshman, Talia Crichton, is a cousin of senior DE Daniel Te'o-Nesheim while sophomore tailback Johri Fogerson is related to both Nate Robinson (former UW football and basketball player; current New York Knick) and former Husky basketball standout Dion Brown. Lastly, freshman quarterback Keith Price is a cousin of former UW tailback Jelani Harrison. Incidentally, at least four Huskies have close family ties to Washington State. Both T.J. Poe's and Cameron Elisara's fathers played at WSU, as did Husky cornerback Desmond Trufant's brother Marcus. Freshman safety Nate Fellner is the grandson of former WSU head coach Jim Sweeney.

OVERALL ATHLETIC SUCCESS: Having firmly established itself as one of the top broad-based Division I intercollegiate athletics programs in the country, the University of Washington once again placed in the top echelon in the annual U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup competition in the 2008-2009 academic year. Husky athletics finished 11th among all NCAA Division I institutions (271 schools earned at least a point and were ranked) in the annual standings. Washington scored a total of 1010.25 points in the Director's Cup, which is based solely on NCAA championship competition (and therefore didn't include the Huskies' national championship in men's rowing, which is not an NCAA sport). The 2008-09 Washington athletic season was highlighted by a number of team and individual successes, including NCAA championships in women's cross country and softball, plus the national title in men's rowing. The Huskies also won the Pac-10 championship in women's cross country (posting the best possible score), men's basketball and men's golf and posted top-10 NCAA finishes in men's golf, women's rowing, women's volleyball and women's tennis.

THE UW – TOP OF ITS CLASS: Here are some interesting facts about the UW:

- For over 30 years, UW faculty have been tops in America in winning federal support for research. Since 1974, the UW has been the number one public university in America in receiving federal funding for its research.
- In recent rankings of universities all over the world published in The Economist magazine, the UW was judged to be the 17th best university on earth.
- The most recent U.S. News & World Reports rankings of American universities rated the UW as the No. 11 public institution in the country.
- As a measure of the University's commitment to public service, the UW has more of its graduates serving all over the world in the Peace Corps than any other university in the country.
- In a new program called "Husky Promise" announced last year and starting this fall, Washington state students from low income families will be able to attend the UW without ever having to worry about paying tuition--it will be free for them while they earn their bachelor's degree. The UW program is one of the largest in the nation making this commitment to those from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

By season's end, Locker's 986 yards were a Pac-10 and school single-season record and second-most in a *career* by a UW QB. Locker's 157-yard rushing day vs. Arizona was ranked No. 3 on the UW's single-game, QB rushing list, behind Denny Fitzpatrick's 249 (vs. WSU, 1974) and Marques Tuiasosopo's 207 (vs. Stanford, 1999).
