## Huskies Open Road Stretch At Oregon State Friday

Friday, Oct. 10, 2008

Washington (6-3-1, 1-0-1 Pac-10) at Oregon State (3-5-3, 0-1-1 Pac-10) • 7:30 p.m.  
Patrick Wayne Valley Stadium • Corvallis, Ore.

**This Week:** Riding a five-match unbeaten streak, Washington men's soccer (6-3-1, 1-0-1 Pac-10) will travel to Corvallis, Ore., to take on Northwest foe Oregon State, Friday, Oct. 10, at 7:30 p.m. The contest marks the beginning of a three-game road trip after the Huskies played five-straight at home, a stretch that saw them post an undefeated 4-0-1 record. UW opened its Pac-10 slate last weekend with a 1-0 win over Stanford and a 2-2 double-overtime draw with then-No. 10 California. The Huskies share the top spot in the conference standings with Cal at 1-0-1 so far in league play. Next week, UW will travel to Southern California for matches at UCLA (Oct. 17) and San Diego State (Oct. 19).

**In the Rankings:** Washington received votes in this week's NSCAA/adidas and Soccer Times polls. The Huskies are also ranked 30th according to CollegeSoccerNews.com. UW is still unranked by Soccer America and Top Drawer Soccer.

**Scouting The Huskies:** Washington made the most of its recent five-game homestand, going 4-0-1 during that stretch. In fact since opening the season 0-2, the Huskies are unbeaten in seven of their last eight games - the only loss in that span being a 3-1 loss to Portland. Washington's five-game unbeaten streak is its longest since UW opened the 2006 season with eight-straight wins. The Huskies opened Pac-10 play last weekend, earning a 1-0 victory over Stanford and battling to a 2-2- double overtime draw with defending Pac-10 champion California. Freshman midfielder Casey McCool's first collegiate goal lifted UW over the Cardinal to open conference play on Friday. The Huskies then welcomed the Golden Bears to Husky Soccer Field on Sunday. UW came from behind twice to tie the score in both the first and second-halves, then took Cal through 20 minutes of overtime to settle for the draw. Husky senior midfielder Raphael Cox scored the first goal to even the score 1-1 in the opening half, then assisted junior defender Casey Cunningham's goal to tie the game 2-2 in the 73rd minute. Cunningham's first career goal came at a good time for the Huskies, heading a corner kick from Cox into the net. Cox has been an offensive powerhouse for the Huskies, tallying four goals and two assists in the last four matches. He has taken over the team lead for goals (five), assists (three) and points (13). His five goals already surpass his career-high of four set during his sophomore campaign. UW's freshman frontline tandem is right behind Cox in offensive production. Brent Richards has four goals, two assists and 10 points, while Dylan Tucker-Gangnes has two goals, two assists and six points. Senior co-captain George John, a Hermann Trophy candidate, continues to anchor the midfield and assist in the backline when necessary. Cunningham and fellow junior Taylor Hoss solidify the Husky defense. Goalkeepers Stephen Fung and Rylan Hawkins have split time tending the net this season. Fung played both matches last weekend, earning the shutout against Stanford and grabbing five saves against Cal. Fung has a 1.57 goals against average and has 12 saves this season, while Hawkins has a 0.84 goals against average to go along with 10 saves.

**Offensive Firepower:** The Huskies began the week tied with California for 22nd in the nation and first in the Pac-10 in scoring offense with 2.0 goals per game. Senior midfielder Raphael Cox ranks 43rd in the nation in points per game (1.44) and is 55th in goals per game (0.56). In the Pac-10, Cox leads in points per game (1.44) and goals per game (0.56). Freshman forward Brent Richards leads the league in shots per game (4.0) and is tied for sixth in points per game (1.0) and is seventh in goals per game (0.40).

**Scouting Oregon State:** Oregon State opened Pac-10 play last weekend with a 3-0 loss to California and a 1-1 double-overtime draw with Stanford. The matches marked the first home games for OSU since it hosted the Hensor/Zaher Memorial Diadora Classic back in early September. The Beavers are winless in their last three matches, also playing to a 1-1 draw with Loyola Marymount in their non-conference finale, Sept. 28. Senior forward Robby Christner leads the squad with six goals and one assist for 13 points. His six goals lead the Pac-10 heading into the second week of conference play. Junior goalkeeper Mike Miller has played nine of 11 games, recording a 1.09 goals against average and grabbing 21 saves.

**All-Time Series Vs. Oregon State:** Washington leads the all-time series with Oregon State, 28-7-3. The last three meetings between these squads were determined in overtime, all by a different result. Last year, UW battled OSU to a 2-2 double overtime draw in Corvallis after the Beavers defeated the Huskies 2-1 in overtime in Seattle. The last UW win came on Nov. 3, 2006, a 2-1 win in Corvallis. UW is 12-4-3 against the Beavers in Corvallis.

**Versus Ranked Opponents:** Washington is 1-1-1 overall against ranked opponents this season. UW suffered a 2-1 overtime defeat to then-No. 10 Virginia Tech on Aug. 31, defeated then-No. 24 New Mexico 3-2, Sept. 21, and earned a 2-2 double-overtime draw with California, Oct. 3.

**Wurzberger Wins 200 At UW:** With the Huskies' 3-2 win over New Mexico on Sept. 21, Dean Wurzberger notched his 200th win as the head coach of the UW men's soccer program. In his 17th season on Montlake and 18th overall in the collegiate head coaching ranks, Wurzberger's Husky record now stands at 202-94-33. Since 1992, he has taken the Huskies to the NCAA Tournament 12 times, including 11 appearances in the last 13 seasons. For good measure, he has sent 13 players to the Major League Soccer ranks, including many more to various professional leagues. Wurzberger was the head coach at Sacramento State for one season (1985) before taking over the reins at Washington. His career record stands at 210-102-38.

**More Accolades For George John:** More national accolades rolled in for senior midfielder George John, as the Husky co-captain was named a candidate for the 2008 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award, Sept. 17. The Senior CLASS Award is based on dedication and achievement in four areas: classroom, character, community and competition. The 30-player field will be narrowed to 10 in October. A nationwide vote will be held Oct. 9-Nov. 19, with the winner being announced during the NCAA College Cup. John is also on the watch list for the 2008 Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy. A list of 15 semifinalists is selected by a coaches committee in November with three finalists announced in early December. They will be invited to the Missouri Athletic Club in St. Louis, Mo., for a news conference on Jan. 9, 2009, where the winner will be announced, with a presentation banquet following. A two-year co-captain for Washington, John is a two-time NSCAA All-Far West Region and two-time All-Pac-10 honoree. He was a first-team All-Pac-10 team member in 2007, helping the Huskies to their second-straight trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. John has also excelled in the classroom, earning NSCAA Scholar All-American status last year and is a two-time Pac-10 all-academic selection. The recipients of the MAC Hermann Trophy are selected by Division I head coaches who are current members of the National Soccer Coaches Association of America.

**Offensive Explosion:** The eight goals the Huskies scored in back-to-back games in South Carolina (Sept. 5 and 7) marked the most since UW scored nine goals in consecutive matches to open the 2006 season versus UC Davis (5-0, Aug. 25) and Air Force (4-1, Sept. 1). The eight goals were the most scored by a UW team during a weekend series since 1998. That year, Washington netted 13 goals in contests with UC Santa Barbara (9-1) and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo (4-0).

**Sharing the Wealth:** In Washington's 10 games, 15 different players have contributed either a goal or an assist. Two more new Huskies entered the offensive stat column after last weekend, with red-shirt-freshman defender Jamie Finch and sophomore midfielder Matt Van Houten recording assists on the same goal by Raphael Cox versus Cal. Two Huskies also scored their first collegiate goals last weekend in junior defender Casey Cunningham and freshman midfielder Casey McCool.

**Huskies Projected To Finish Fourth In Pac-10 Coaches' Poll:** Washington was predicted to finish fourth in this season's Pac-10 standings according to a vote of the league's coaches the conference office announced, Aug. 13. California, coming off back-to-back Pac-10 championships, was picked to win a third-straight crown, followed by UCLA, Stanford, the Huskies, San Diego State and Oregon State. Cal received four first-place votes with the other two going to UCLA and Stanford. Washington was one of three Pac-10 squads to earn a spot in last year's NCAA Men's Soccer Championship, advancing as far as the second round for the second-straight season. The Huskies compiled an overall record of 9-8-4 and finished fifth in the league with a 3-4-3 tally.

**Fab Frosh:** The Washington men's soccer incoming recruiting class was ranked 32nd in the nation according to CollegeSoccerNews.com, the website announced. The Huskies' incoming freshmen group includes goalkeeper Brooks Hopp from Seattle who was tabbed one of "100 Freshmen To Keep an Eye On" this season by CSN. Headlining the class is also Brent Richards, a forward from Camas who was named the 2008 Gatorade State Player of the Year for Washington. Additional freshmen who could make an impact on the squad right away include midfielders Casey McCool from Bend, Ore., and Dylan Tucker-Gangnes from Bainbridge Island, Wash. Two other Pac-10 squads joined Washington in the CSN rankings with UCLA at No. 8 and California at No. 20.

**2007 Season Review:** In 2007, Washington finished the season with a 9-8-4 overall record and placed fifth in the Pac-10 (3-4-3). The Huskies earned an NCAA Tournament berth for the 11th time in 13 years and advanced as far as the second round for the second-straight season. UW downed Portland 1-0 in a first-round match in Seattle, the gamewinner coming from an Ely Allen penalty kick. The Huskies traveled to Southern California to face the defending champs UC Santa Barbara, falling for the second-straight year by a one-goal deficit (1-0). Season highlights included UW notching the program's 500th all-time victory and head coach Dean Wurzberger winning his 200th career game.

For the second-straight season, a Husky was tabbed Pac-10 Player of the Year - an honor going to Allen who shared the award with Cal's Andrew Jacobson. Allen was also named to the All-Pac-10 first-team, was a College Soccer News second-team All-American and earned NSCAA All-Far West Region honors. George John was also named to the All-Far West Region team. Washington's great tradition of sending players to the professional ranks continued with Ely Allen being selected in the second round of the MLS SuperDraft by the L.A. Galaxy. Kevin Forrest, whose senior year was cut short due to injury, was picked up by Colorado in the MLS Supplemental Draft.

**Head Coach Dean Wurzberger:** Husky coach Dean Wurzberger is in his 17th year at the helm of the Washington men's soccer program. The 2004 Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in program history, Wurzberger has spent nearly two decades building the Husky program into one of the nation's finest, fielding teams that annually compete for conference and national championships. Under his tutelage, the Huskies have reached the NCAA Tournament 11 times in the last 13 years, including a school-record Sweet 16 trip in 2003. His record at Washington stands at a stellar 202-94-33 (.663).
